## Did You Know?

- ⇒ Domestic violence/abuse/battering is an on-going pattern of abusive behavior by one partner in order to have control and power over the other partner.
- ⇒ Domestic violence is a learned behavior and can be unlearned.
- ⇒ Physical abuse is only one type of abusive behavior used to control or intimidate the victim.
- ⇒ Domestic violence occurs in every ethnic, socioeconomic, sexual orientation, religious and age group.
- ⇒ Domestic violence is not about anger...it is about power and control.
- ⇒ 1 in 3 women has experienced abuse in their relationship.
- ⇒ Anyone can be a victim... men as well as women.
- ⇒ 1 in 3 of all youth have experienced domestic violence in a dating relationship.
- ⇒ 58% of seniors experience domestic violence in their relationships.
- ⇒ The majority of abuse among seniors is intimate partner abuse.
- ⇒ 24% of seniors are abused by their children.
